- 3. Introductions All Members in Attendance
 - a. Review and approve June 4th Agenda
 - Approved.
 - b. Review and approve Minutes from March meeting

- 4. Old Business Joanna Stokes (10 minutes)
 - a. Alberta School Council Engagement (ASCE) Grant
 - It was geared towards numeracy and was a great success.
 - Members appreciated the different learning levels to ensure there was something for all participants.
 - Thank you to the administration for organizing and to the Fundraising Society and personal donations to top up the amount required to host the event.

b. ASCA Symposium and AGM

- Joanna attended the event from the ELES School Council.
- Minister of Education and Childcare, Demetrios Nicolaides attended.

c. BGSD ACE Event

- Lots of great discussions took place and the questions were challenging but engaging.
- There was great value in having students attend and that is was well facilitated.
- The breakout sessions were small in size but gave people the opportunity to share their perspectives.
- 5. New Business
 - a. Maturation Unit Anticipating gov't will require opt-in link to curriculum
 - Caregivers currently have to "opt out". However, it is anticipated that it will change to an "opt in".
 - New legislative bill can be found here Bill 27

b. Transportation Update - sign up for 2025-26 school year, reduced fees until June 30 link

- Ensure you sign up for bussing.
- Kilometers are not changing from the 2024/2025 year.

c. Principal's Report - Erin Keca

- ACME circus happening on June 11th.
- Grade 3 and 4 music extravaganza was fantastic.
- New photographer will be used next year for school photo's.
- Out of school care (OSC) is being looked into.
 - **o** It is a minimum of 6 months to get licensing.
 - o Open to certain companies that meet BGSD criteria.
 - o The BGSD has had success with the current provider looking into setting up OSC in other schools.
- There will be some changes to the bell times starting in the fall.
- Mental health week.
 - **o** Grades 1-3 were separated up to be with different age groups.
 - **o** Believed it went well.
- ELES will be raising the ceiling for field trip fees.
 - **o** This does not mean that fees will increase. It will allow to accommodate when certain field trip fees exceed the previous ceiling when required.
- Mother's and Father's Day approach from ELES Lions Look Ahead May 5-9, 2025.
 - **o** Staff brought up concerns when some children were getting emotional regarding Mother's and Father's Day.
 - **o** Thought was to accommodate for children with different family structures. It was not meant to be a direction to eliminate Mother's and Father's Day.
 - After the announcement, concerns were brought up by parents around the messaging.
 - **o** Below are ideas being brought forward regarding Mother's/Father's Day:
 - Plan to incorporate crafts during mental health week.
 - Seek input and advice from social workers and psychologists for the kids affected.
 - Classroom based, "I appreciate my caregiver" activities.
 - These would allow for students in different circumstances the opportunity to appreciate loved ones in their lives.
 - **o** Attendees of the School Council meeting brought up concerns and comments around the decision to move away from Mother's/Father's Day.
 - Highlighted the decision that was made was in the minority of all Alberta schools and not directed to ELES by BGSD.
 - It should have been a conversation with the School Council prior to making the decision.
 - It is great to accommodate for children with different circumstances at home. However, majority have Mothers and Fathers.
- Another question raised during the Principal's report. Will the grade 4/5 split continue to 5/6?
 - o It does not appear that it will. Appears that there will be larger class sizes.
 - Ratio increases area all around Alberta not just BGSD/ELES.

d. Assistant Principal's Report - Tarynne Cable

- Spring fling was great.
- Lots of sporting events such as floor hockey, flag football, badminton and the track meet.
- Jump rope for the heart raised just over \$1700.
