Busing information from Division Office

- There are five different bus routes that pick up students attending Ecole Leduc Estates
 School
 - two rural routes (which pick up students in the rural areas, as well as within the City of Leduc)
 - two urban routes (only pick up students living within the City). All of our rural routes go to the transfer site, as rural routes pick up K-12 students who then go to the transfer site at ELJHS and transfer to a bus that takes them to their particular school. We do this to ensure that all of our buses are full (rural and urban) in order to operate within our Transportation grant funding.
- There are multiple supervisors at the transfer site. The buses at the transfer site are scheduled to be there for no longer than 10 minutes (unless a bus gets there early for some reason)
- If parents have questions about routes and comparison between two routes, please contact our Transportation department
- It is very important that parents register for transportation in June for the following school year.
 - o This provides our Transportation department with time to plan and design the most effective routes.
 - o When parents register in August and September, the routes are already designed and we make adjustments to accommodate students who are eligible for transportation but we cannot always just add another bus for a particular school.
